Minister for Transport David Campbell today said Director General of the Ministry of Transport Jim Glasson was resigning from his position effective Friday 29 May.

Mr Campbell said Mr Glasson had served in the role for more than three years and was resigning to take up an opportunity in the private sector.

“Mr Glasson has been a dedicated contributor to public transport improvements during his time at the Ministry,” Mr Campbell said.

“I am professionally and personally saddened by his resignation but recognise that all government departments can benefit from renewal and the Ministry of Transport is no exception.

“I want to thank Mr Glasson for his dedication to his work and wish him well in his future endeavours.”

Mr Campbell said Mr Glasson would be taking up a role as CEO at ComfortDelGro Cabcharge.

“Mr Glasson has an extensive history in the NSW public service, having worked on rail services for the Sydney Olympics and held several roles involving ports and freight efficiency across the state, including a period as Acting CEO of Port Kembla Port Corporation during 2004/05,” Mr Campbell said.

Mr Campbell said that Ministry’s Deputy Director General Joanna Quilty would act in the role, pending a decision on a permanent replacement.
